Artemisia

- grown for their silvery grey foliage and ease of maintenance
- yellowish white, whitish-green flower

- Flower: spire like clusters of small white, pink, or reddish flowers.
- Leaf: compound basal leaves, largely toothed serrations, generally three leaves to a leaflet.

Astilbe





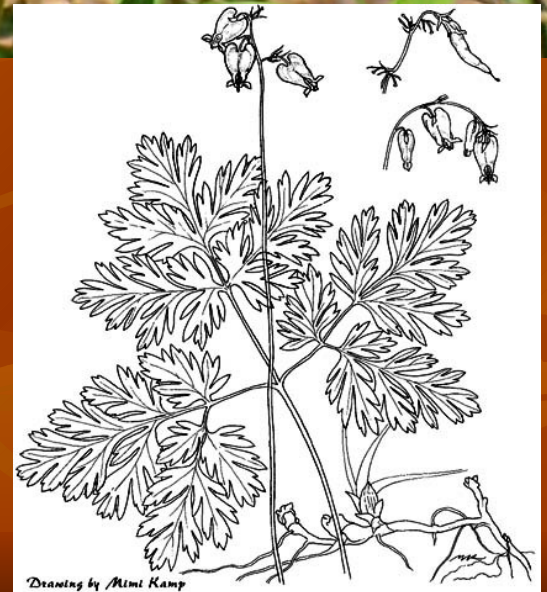
Black Eyed Susan

- Flower: yellow, daisy like flowers with a dark center disk
- Leaf: ovate, pointed, and medium toothed

Bleeding Heart



- Leaf:
deeply
serrated,
compound
leaflets

Chrysanthemum



- Flower: showy brightly colored flower heads
- Leaf: 5 lobed, sharply serrated



Clematis



- plants or woody vines
- Flower: showy, variously colored, six petals, with spiky center
- Leaf: three individual leaves on one leaflet



Columbine

- Flower: showy, variously colored, five rounded petals in front of five more pointed petals of a different color
- Leaf: three leaves per leaflet, roundly



- Flower: disk flowers on a cone-shaped central receptacle surrounded by colorful ray flowers
- Leaf: three leaves per leaflet, top leaf has 3 lobes while other two are ovate and pointed, all have largely toothed serrations

Coralbells



- Flowers: clusters of small, bell-shaped, red to white flowers
- Leaf: deep green to purple in color, heart shaped with five main lobes



Coreopsis

- Flower: radiate flower heads with yellow or, pink, purplish flowers
- Leaf: skinny leaf, with rounded tip



Cranesbill Geranium



- Flower: five petals arranged around a central lighter point
- Leaf: sharply toothed leaf with five lobes



Crocus

- Leaf: having grasslike leaves
- Flower: showy, variously colored flowers with yellow centers
- Bulb plant



Daffodill



- Flower: showy, usually yellow flowers with a trumpet-shaped center, six petals
- Leaf: comes directly out of ground, long, skinny, and waxy
- Bulb plant

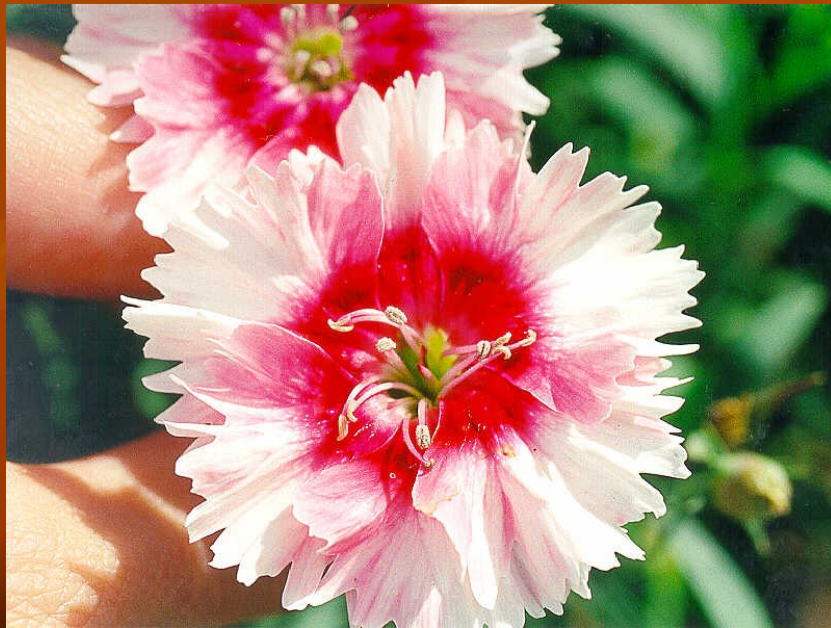
- Leaf: long, grass like leaves
- Flower: yellow, orange, or red lilylike flowers.

Daylily



- Flower: small carnation like flower, with sharply toothed petals.
- Leaf: long narrow stem with small, skinny, pointed leaves

Dianthus



Hosta

- Leaf: clumps of long-lasting foliage, large heart shaped
- Flower: one sided white, blue, or lilac flowers



Hyacinth



- Flower: cylindrical cluster of fragrant flowers in a variety of colors.
- Leaf: long, waxy, slender leaf
- Bulb plant



Iris



- Leaf: sword-shaped, in a fan like arrangement
- Flower: showy, variously colored flowers



Lady's Mantle



- Leaf: leaves with rounded and finely serrated lobes
- Flower: small yellow clusters



Lavendar

- Flower: clusters of small purplish flowers that yield an oil used in perfumery
- Leaf: tiny, spiny, almost grass like



Ornamental Grass



Perennial Fern



- Leaf: many leaflets make up one leaf, leaflets are finely serrated.

Pulmonaria



- Leaf: elongated, ovate, waxy, with random white spots



- Flower: small purple, with five petals



Sedum



- Leaf: small to medium, overlapping leaves, very succulent (juicy)
- Flower: yellow, white, or pink flowers.



Shasta Daisy



- Flower: large, white, daisylike flowers
- Leaf: very skinny, twiggy, stems, with skinny pointed leaves

Tulip



- Leaf: lance-shaped leaves
- Flower: large, showy, usually erect, cup-shaped or bell-shaped flowers in a variety of colors.
